### Wootton Bassett and Cricklade

80 bed home providing a mixture of nursing and care for people with dementia, 64 bed nursing home, 50 unit extra care scheme and 45 - 60 unit extra care scheme in Cricklade

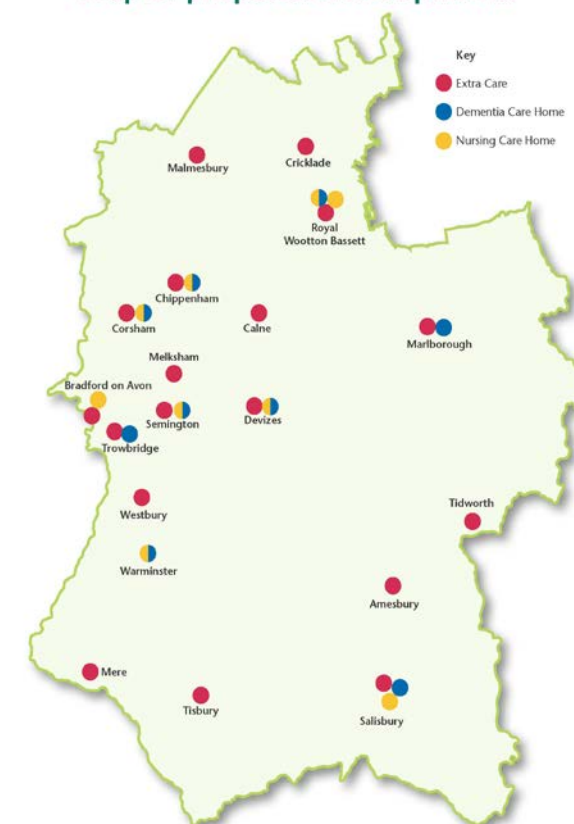

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# Older People Development Strategy

Information Leaflet – Summer 2012

## Drivers for change

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The number of people over the age of 65 is due to grow by around 56% between now and 2026 and cases of dementia will increase by around 59% by 2025.

During this period Wiltshire Council is projected to spend £3.3 billion on care for older people in facilities that will become increasingly unfit for purpose. To address this, Wiltshire Council has developed a strategy that will:

- modernise the way older people's accommodation is provided
- develop and adopt an integrated accommodation system
- ensure the best use of increasingly scarce resources
- respond to local needs in local communities.

## Aims of the strategy

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The strategy will provide 'fit for purpose' state of the art accommodation that will meet the needs of and provide choice to the growing population of older people.

Instead of relying on traditional residential care, new types of accommodation and community schemes will allow people to remain in their own homes for longer and receive the care they require. The intention is to:

- allow people to remain independent for longer
- enable people to remain in their communities with the social networks they have already developed
- provide people with more choice and control
- ensure specialist care services are there for people when they need them

## Accommodation provision

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The strategy looked at the current accommodation provision in Wiltshire as well as the projected population and people with dementia increases by community area to determine what type of facilities will be required and where.

To meet its commissioning intentions, the council is set to develop a range of facilities which include:

- Nursing care homes
- Specialist care homes for people with dementia
- Extra care facilities
- Community extra care schemes
- Remodelled sheltered housing schemes

## Extra care

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Extra care facilities will provide individual 2 bedroomed flats that will either be available for purchase, rent or shared ownership where care is provided on site and tailored to individual needs.

Extra care schemes usually also include communal facilities for tenants such as lounges, cafes / restaurants, hairdressers and spaces where local health professionals can provide services.

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Over the next ten years, the Council will be helping to provide the following developments:

### Amesbury

60 unit extra care scheme

### Bradford on Avon

60 bed nursing home and 18 unit extra care scheme

### Calne

60 unit extra care scheme

### Chippenham

80 bed home providing a mixture of nursing and care for people with dementia and a 60 unit extra care scheme

### Corsham

80 bed home providing a mixture of nursing and care for people with dementia and a 50 unit extra care scheme

### Devizes

80 bed home providing a mixture of nursing and care for people with dementia and a 50 unit extra care scheme

### Malmesbury

50 unit extra care scheme

### Marlborough

16 bed nursing extension for people with dementia and 60 unit extra care scheme

### Melksham

60 unit extra care scheme in the town centre with a 60 bed home providing a mixture of nursing and care for people with dementia and 18 unit extra care scheme in Semington

### Mere

45 unit extra care scheme to meet nursing needs
